## SECTION G – SUTTON TRUST Topline Results 21/11/03

- Fieldwork for the MORI Teachers' Omnibus covered a representative sample of 984 primary and secondary teachers in England and Wales
- These results for the Sutton Trust are based on the responses of 479 secondary teachers working in England and Wales
- Results are based on all respondents unless otherwise stated
- Data are weighted to age, sex, phase and Government Office Region
- Fieldwork was conducted by telephone between 8 October and 7 November 2003
- Where results do not sum to 100, this may be due to multiple responses, computer rounding or the exclusion of don't knows/not stated
- An asterisk (\*) represents a value of less than one half of one percent, but not zero
