Life Lessons Polling 2017

- Employers were surveyed via the YouGov Business Omnibus, a poll of senior business decision makers (excluding sole traders) in Great Britain. 1,133 employers were surveyed between 30th May – 5th June 2017 through an online questionnaire. Data are weighted and are nationally representative of business size.
- Teachers were surveyed through the National Foundation for Educational Research's Teacher Voice survey, a three-times
 yearly poll conducted online with teachers from the maintained sector in England, in both primary and secondary
 schools. 1,361 practising teachers, from headteachers to newly qualified class teachers, were surveyed in March 2017.
 The school sample is nationally representative of key factors, including free school meals eligibility, region, school
 performance, school type and local authority type.
- Young people were surveyed through the Ipsos MORI Young People Omnibus, a representative survey of 11-16 year olds
 attending mainstream state schools in England and Wales. Interviews of 2,612 young people were carried out through a
 self-completion questionnaire across over 100 schools between February and May 2017. Data are weighted by sex, age
 and region to match the population of pupils aged 11-16 in England and Wales.
