School Funding and Pupil Premium

April 2021



NFER surveyed teachers across England in March 2021. A panel of 1,535 practising teachers from 1,349 schools in the publicly funded sector in England completed the survey. Teachers completed the survey online during the period 12 to 17 March 2021. The panel included teachers from the full range of roles in primary and secondary schools, from headteachers to class teachers. Out of the respondents 816 (53.2%) were teaching in primary schools and 719 (46.8%) were teaching in secondary schools.
